



Emmons Team Hits Indy With Six-Car Attack

The Lucas Oil-backed Emmons Motorsports team is attacking the 57th annual Mac Tools U.S. Nationals presented by Lucas Oil, the biggest event in drag racing and one at which the team has a rich history of success, with an onslaught of six cars.

"No matter what our racing schedule is or what we have going on back at work, nothing ever interferes with the Bowling Green Division 3 race or the U.S. Nationals," says Jerry Emmons, one of three Emmons brothers entered this year. Also competing will be Jerry's brothers, Terry and Gary; the only one missing will be older brother Harvey "Speedy" Emmons, who kicked off his season with a Stock victory at the Division 4 Lucas Oil Series event at the Emmons brothers' home track, Houston.

All three Emmons brothers will have two shots at victory this year; each will be competing in both Super Stock and Stock. Terry will be at the wheel of Jeff Teuton's Southland Dodge AA/SA '11 Challenger, the original DragPak

prototype, which is powered by a 512-cubic-inch Hemi and is expected to be a top contender for AA/SA class honors. Jerry will be in his usual Stock ride, the Lucas Oil Products B/SA '69 Camaro, and Terry in his, the Lucas Oil Products C/SA '98 Firebird.

In Super Stock, Jerry will field a GT/CA '91 Calais, Gary a SS/JA '96 Firebird, and Terry a SS/GA '69 Camaro. All have multiple national event victories to their credit, but the single biggest win of the Emmons brothers' 34 total national titles is Jerry's in Stock at the 1994 U.S. Nationals. He also was runner-up at the event in 1999, also in Stock.
